Lesson Title: Microsoft Publisher Country Brochure

Lesson Summary

This lesson is based on a WebQuest in which students are to create a *Microsoft Publisher* brochure. After selecting a country, students will look for the answers to the essential and guiding questions using the links provided on the WebQuest. Once students have found all the answers, they will create a word web using *Kidspiration* and proceed to design their country's brochure.

Once the lesson has been introduced to students, the teacher should get students started on their research and should be available to answer their questions and provide assistance.

Students Activities and Timeline

First Week

Teacher will discuss the project requirements by discussing the WebQuest, and reviewing the checklist. He/she will demonstrate how to use Kidspiration to create a graphic organizer to organize the data they will collect.

Students will be choose a country and will seek their teacher's approval. After obtaining her approval, they will proceed to answer the questions. They will create a graphic organizer to organize the data they collect.

Second Week

Teacher will present a sample Microsoft Publisher Brochure and will teach students how to use Publisher to create their brochures. Teachers will guide students during the creation of their project and will serve as facilitator in case they have questions or need assistance.

Third Week

Teacher will continue to guide students as they finalize their presentations. After completing their presentations, students will present them to the rest of the class.

Assessments

- A checklist will ensure that students will follow instructions and remain on task.
- Students will be assessed based on how they follow the requirements on the checklist.

Reflections

A class discussion will allow students to talk openly about what part of the assignment they enjoyed the most, and which task was the most difficult.
